I know summer camp is still 6 months away, but another Camp Alexander deadline is rapidly approaching. We have asked for 2 campsites to accommodate a minimum of 42 Scouts. As of now, we have less than 20 Scouts committed to Camp A. We have until January 20th to decide if we need both campsites. If we do not have enough Scouts signed up by then, we will need to drop the smaller campsite. That will limit the total number of Scouts and adults who can attend to 33.

The Haiti Earthquake

There was a very tragic thing that happened in Haiti on Tuesday, January 12, 2010. There was a 7.0 earthquake which was the worst one in a century. This happened at 5 p.m. about 10 miles away from Port-au-Prince. It is estimated that about one million people were affected by this quake. This earthquake was so big it could be felt in Cuba which is 200 miles away. On Sunday the 15th they had buried around 150,000 people, which is the population of Lakewood. They estimate that there will be 250,000 more dead, which is the population of Aurora. Of those who are still alive, there are about 250,000 that are injured. Days later the people were still experiencing aftershocks that were a magnitude of 5.0. This part of the country was already poverty stricken, and now so many more are homeless and hungry. Troop 113 Leadership Positions for Fall 2009

During the last JLT session, position duties and expectations for the PLC were clarified. Here are the important expectations for fall 2009 that you need to know:

SPL: Responsible for calling ASPLS and PL to remind them of the PLC meetings. Reminds PLs of their weekly assignment for each meeting.

ASPL: PLC leaders, excepting PLs, report to one of the 3 ASPLs, ASPL 1 is responsible for the Scribe, Historian and Newsletter Editor; forwards newsletter material to the publisher. ASPL 2 is responsible for the QM and Librarian and will update the Troop QM with needs and wants. ASPL 3 is responsible for the Instructors, Guides, Chaplin's Aid and OA Rep. Each ASPL is responsible for reminding their group of PLC meetings. ASPLs will coordinate the activities of their groups with the SPL.

PL: Ensures patrol flag, and yell are current and everyone in patrol knows the yell.

Scribe: Take minutes at the PLC and write up for the SPL and SM. Provide upcoming event dates to the Newsletter editor. Collects dues.

Historian: Maintain/create a photo album for each event. Write up a summary of each event to include with the photos. Provide event photos to the Newsletter editor. Ensure we have a current poster board for Webelos meet and greet in November.

Newsletter Editor: Is considered a Scribe position for leadership positions. Provides dates of future events, event summaries and photos for the monthly newsletter to ASPL 1. Fills in for Scribe as needed.

QMs: QM 1 is responsible for troop equipment and informing ASPL 2 of equipment issues. QM 2 is responsible for the food inventory and should maintain a list of current stock. Both QMs will help coordinate shed maintenance, and shed, equipment and trailer clean up as needed.

Librarian: Maintain MB library and sign out sheet. Provide a list of new MB books needed to ASPL 2. Coordinates donations of "used" MB books.

OA Rep: Attends at least 50% of OA meetings. Attends OA events when possible. Provides OA event dates to ASPL 3.

Troop Guides/Instructors: Help with rank advancement through First Class. Assists with visiting Webelos during Troop meetings and campouts.

To earn credit for your leadership position, you are expected to attend at least 50% of Troop activities in addition to the above expectations.
